Dear Supporters and Stakeholders,

It was gratifying to see Merry Go Round Children's Foundation celebrate its 20th anniversary this year. The *Kids, Cops & Computers* program continued to grow and reach more families than ever before with 725 new students enrolled - 625 in Toronto partnering with the Toronto Police Service and 100 students in three provinces across Canada in partnership with the RCMP Foundation. Thanks to the continuous support of generous donors, students participating in the Program were provided brand-new HP laptops, learned new skills and participated in events to celebrate their achievements and benefit others.

Ensuring our youth are given opportunities they would not have otherwise is incredibly important. A key goal of the Program is helping kids develop essential life skills at a vulnerable period in their lives. The *Lead & Learn* sessions they attend during the school year with police officers and educators are aimed at helping youth build a strong foundation of digital literacy and developing stronger relationships with adults and authority figures.

Community partners are key collaborators in our mission to assist kids to reach their potential and we are grateful for their ongoing commitment to *Kids, Cops & Computers*. Our long-term partnerships with the Toronto Police Service, the Toronto District and Toronto Catholic District School Boards has ensured the Program's ongoing success in Toronto.



Meet Hamza, KCC Alumnus

Currently a second-year student completing a Bachelor of Business Administration at York University's Schulich School of Business, Hamza credits the *Kids, Cops & Computers* program for playing an important role in supporting his academic career.

Before joining the *Kids, Cops & Computers* program at North Kipling Junior Middle School in 2011, Hamza had very limited access to technology at home and little knowledge of computer programs. With one desktop computer shared between a family of five, his two older sisters always got priority and left Hamza with little time to put his best foot forward in his schoolwork. After receiving his laptop, Hamza's work habits improved drastically and so did his assignments.

Hamza also found the educator support and police mentoring provided in the *Lead & Learn* sessions to be invaluable.

"When KCC gives you a new laptop, it is just the tip of the iceberg. It is more of a mentorship program," he said. "I was hesitant to approach a police officer when I was little, but when we were able to connect with them through KCC, it helped to show us they are here to serve and protect. They are humans too."

Even though he graduated from the *Kids, Cops* & *Computers* program some years ago, Hamza Muhammad continues to remain actively involved with Merry Go Round Children's Foundation. "The Program gave me opportunities to attend many fundraising events as a volunteer and see how others are living," he says. "It made me realize that it is not impossible for me to achieve my goals and have a successful career as well."

Community Partners

Merry Go Round Children's Foundation is fortunate to have strong partners to deliver the *Kids, Cops & Computers* program to students nation-wide. The Toronto District School Board Toronto Catholic District School Board, and the Toronto Police Service continue to work with staff to deliver programming to schools across Toronto. After forming a partnership in 2015, Merry Go Round Children's Foundation has been working with the RCMP Foundation to roll out the *Kids, Cops & Computers* program in non-metropolitan communities across Canada.

With the help of our partners, over 5,000 students have been assisted to reach their unlimited potential through *Kids, Cops & Computers* since inception in 1998. Over the last three years, 254 students have received access to technology and support in non-metropolitan communities across British Columbia, Alberta, Manitoba, New Brunswick, and Nova Scotia in partnership with the RCMP Foundation.

Toronto Police Officers and the RCMP play a key role in the Program by facilitating five *Lead & Learn* sessions throughout the school year with the support of educators. The sessions explore a variety of topics that help kids feel safe and confident online.


Through this ongoing support during the year, it not only gives students the platform to learn new digital literacy skills but also encourages the development of positive and trusting relationships between police officers and youth in the community.

Building Impact: A Plan for the Future

It is our vision that students participating in *Kids, Cops & Computers* continue to receive quality programming to assist them in reaching their unlimited potential – socially and academically.

This year, Merry Go Round Children's Foundation board members and staff created and approved a five-year Strategic Plan for 2019 - 2023 that aspires to double the number of students benefitting from participation in *Kids*, *Cops & Computers*, ensure the ongoing effectiveness of the Program, increase awareness and increase Merry Go Round Children's Foundation's operating and financial stability.



KCC Program Evaluation

To ensure students participating in the Program are benefitting from *Kids, Cops & Computers*, a full-scale Program Evaluation was carried out in 2017 to measure outcomes of their academic and social development.

The evaluation aimed to provide a baseline for how students in the program are performing and to create effective measurement tools to be used in future evaluations. This evaluation employs a mixed-methods approach that combines qualitative stakeholder data in the form of interviews, online surveys and a quantitative analysis of student achievement data from the Toronto District School Board (TDSB) and the Toronto Catholic District School Board (TCDSB) to investigate the impact of the *KCC* program on the youth in the program.



Data results from students taking part in the Program show that **they are performing slightly ahead** of their peers citywide both before and after participating in *KCC*, and that they **continue to meet provincial standards** over time.

86% of educators have seen significant improvement in their students' digital literacy.

86% of Grade 7 students "really like" police officers and feel comfortable around them since joining the Program.

The *KCC* Program has the capacity to increase student success, maximize their potential to be good community members, and improve their skills and confidence in our increasingly tech-driven world.

Thanks to a gift of \$50,000 from an anonymous donor in support of the Program, the 2016/17 Program Evaluation was completed with program outcomes updated to better highlight and understand the impact the *KCC* Program has on students. The updated outcomes that Merry Go Round will be using to measure student progress and success moving forward are as follows:

- 1. Improved Academic Achievement
- 2. Increased Digital Literacy
- 3. Strong Social-Emotional Wellbeing
- 4. Community Engagement and Citizenship








CELEBRITY SPORTS MIXER




