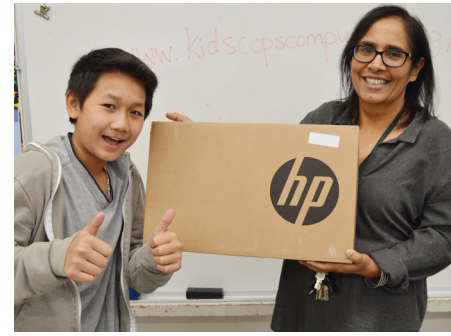

Message from the Chairman & Co-Founder

Dear Supporters and Stakeholders,

We move into the third decade of Merry Go Round Children Foundation's operations (since inception in 1998), with continued expansion in Toronto and across Canada. To date, over 6,000 students have received the benefits of the program to support their long-term success.

After seeing the great work that was accomplished as Kids, Cops & Computers for the first 20 years, our Board embarked upon a branding exercise that led to a new name: ComKids (embodying community, communication, computers, connection, etc)

786 students enrolled in the Program in the 2018/19 school year; with 630 in Toronto and 116 across Canada in partnership with the RCMP Foundation. This school year marked a notable milestone as we launched our program in St. Catharines, my hometown. Through a new partnership formed with the District School Board of Niagara and Niagara Regional Police, we were able to launch the ComKids program at two schools in February 2019 with 40 students participating in the pilot year. I am excited by this opportunity to serve more youth and look forward to continuing to expand to more regions that can benefit from the Program around the Golden Horseshoe.

Providing our youth with new opportunities they would not have otherwise to bridge the digital divide is critical to the purpose behind the Program. I am grateful to our generous stakeholders and Program partners for ensuring the success of the ComKids program. Thanks to their hard work and kind support, participating students are provided with brand-new laptops from our technology partner HP, taught foundational digital literacy skills in their Lead & Learn sessions with police officers, and are given chances to give back to others in their communities to encourage their positive development.

Remembering that our youth are our future leaders and innovators is key behind the importance of the Program. In Grade 7, students need ready access to technology in their homes to develop their creativity, confidence and technical abilities to prepare them for an overall successful future. I sincerely thank our community partners, corporate supporters, and stakeholders for believing in ComKids and our youth.

Meet Shahmeer, ComKids Leader

Currently a Grade 8 student preparing for high school next year, Shahmeer benefitted from his participation in the ComKids program last year.

Before joining the ComKids program in Grade 7, Shahmeer's family shared one computer at home. It was always a waiting game for his turn to complete his homework online as his parents and brother used it to complete their work as well.

"I worried about completing my assignments, and usually, my assignments were handed in late or right by the deadline. Receiving my HP laptop changed everything for me." Having consistent access to technology allowed Shahmeer to complete his projects earlier and not have to stress over his academics.

Access to technology was not the only thing Shahmeer gained from his first year in the program.

He was able to develop his confidence as a young leader through volunteering to give a speech as a ComKids student ambassador at the 15th Annual Celebrity Sports Mixer fundraiser – receiving a standing ovation from all attendees with his heartfelt words. Not only did he groom his tech skills through his Lead & Learn sessions in the program with Officer Gini, but he established a comfortable relationship with her. "I enjoyed the sessions as it was a great way to make new friends. Officer Gini helped our whole group and I always feel safe whenever she is with us."

As a hardworking student with the goal of pursuing medicine in his post-secondary studies, the work and research Shahmeer is now able to do on his own time will further support his future school and career objectives.

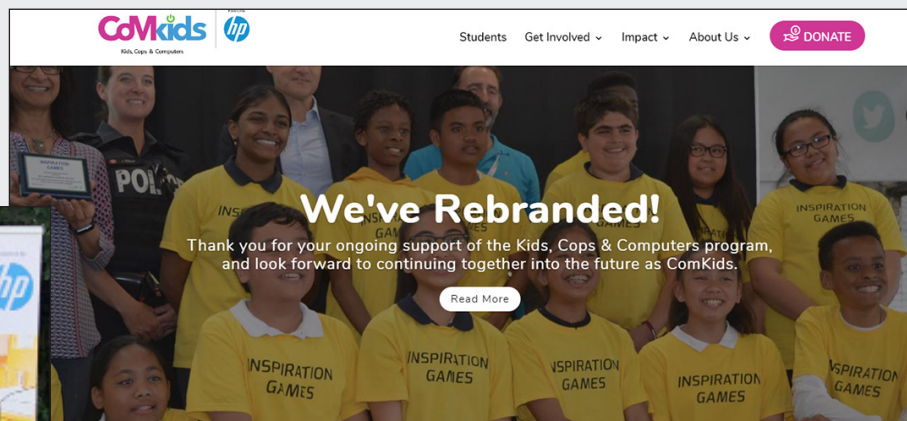

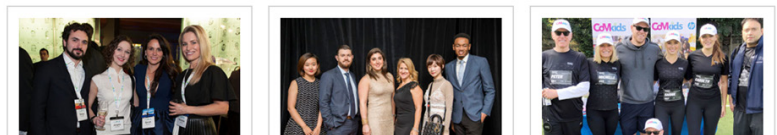
After 20 years operating under Kids, Cops & Computers, the Board of Directors sought to modernize the look and feel of the brand in order to better reflect the organization's intended audiences.

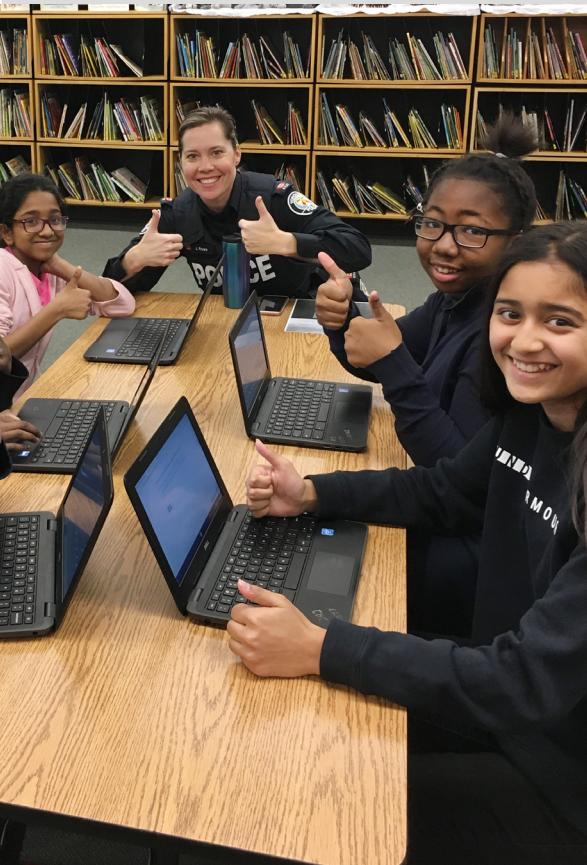
Results Indicate Improved Digital Literacy and Social Skills

Developing as a young adult and learning new skills in today's age is constantly shifting with the rise of technology. The ComKids program aims to assist student success in an advancing world, with a focus on shaping young leaders through encouraging volunteership in the community, improving their digital skills, and building confidence.

Thanks to a gift of \$50,000 from an anonymous donor in support of the Program, the following new outcomes were developed in the 2018 Program Evaluation to measure student success and growth in the program:

1. Improved Academic Achievement
2. Increased Digital Literacy
3. Strong Social-Emotional Wellbeing
4. Community Engagement and Citizenship

Measured Outcomes in the 2018/19 School Year



Before the program, only 67% of students reported that they were able to successfully complete a series of tasks that ComKids has identified as indicators of digital literacy. **Upon completing the program, 83% of students reported that they could complete the same set of tasks, which is a 16% increase in student's digital literacy from before to after the program."**

The survey data shows that 62% of students report to having positive attitudes towards police before the program. After completing the program, 82% of student report having positive attitudes towards police officers, **showing a 20% increase in the amount of students from before to after the program.**

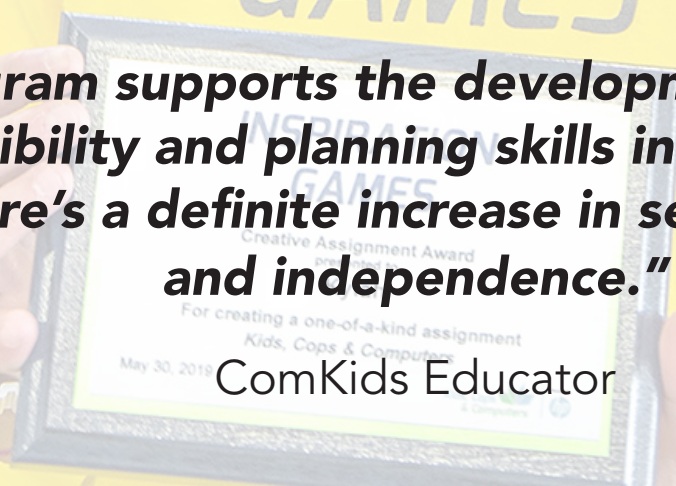

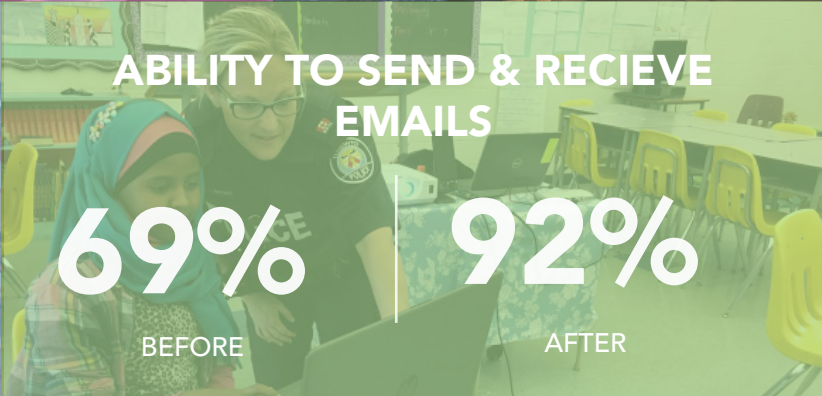

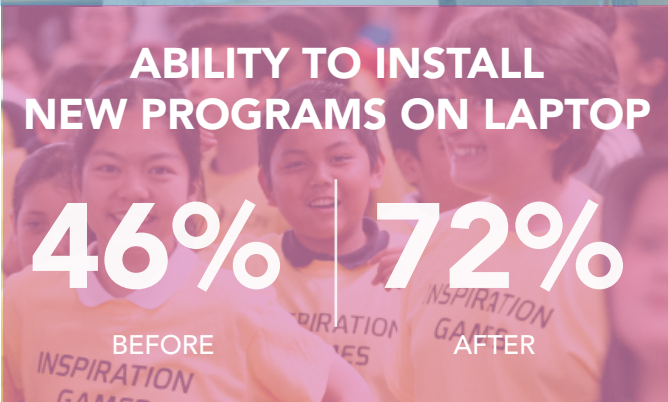

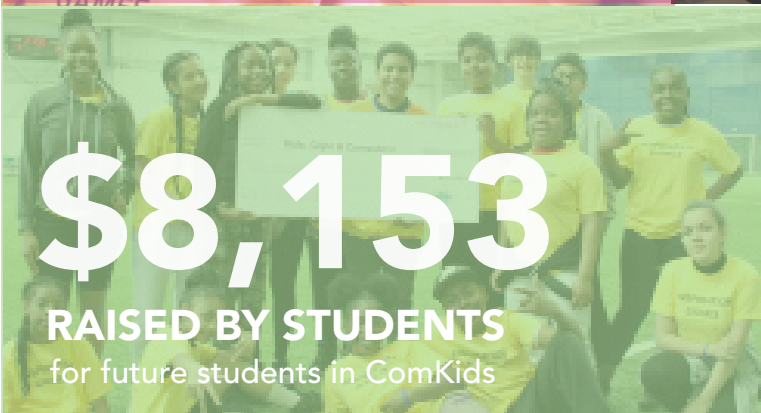

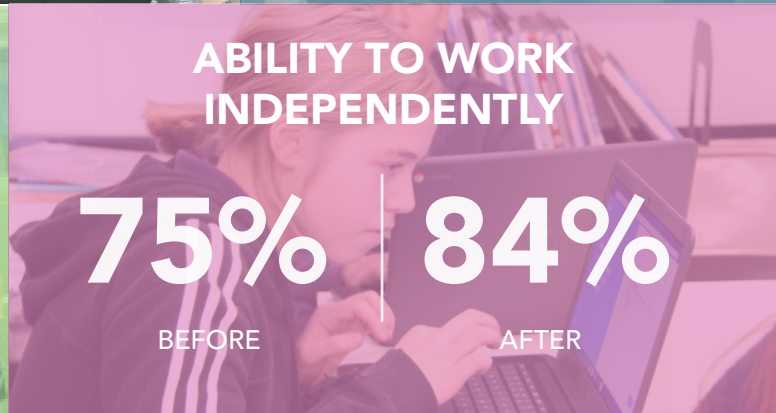

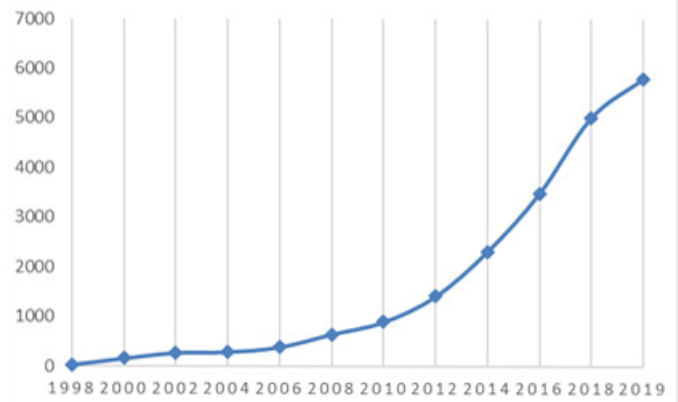

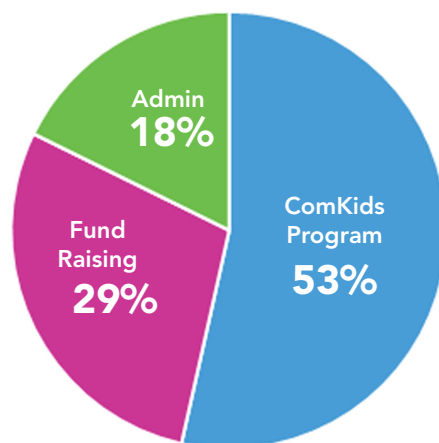
